- Review new foster applications and assist with interviews of potential fosterers
- Liaise with CDPA Kitty Rescue and Rehoming Teams about incoming foster cats and kittens
- Allocate cats and kittens to foster homes based on the fosterer's experience, suitability, availability, and ability to meet the kitties specific foster needs
- Collaborate closely with the Allocations team about Live List Cases and demonstrate a sense of urgency when allocating fosterers
- Review, update and maintain record of incoming cats/kittens and their allocated foster homes
- Foster Database Maintenance (through proactive contact)
